

REMEMBERING JUNE 6, 1944


For those who follow Facebook, you may have noticed on this June 6th the posts honouring those who took part in the start of the liberation of Northwest Europe during the Second World War. Facebook posts were made by our Unit, Friends in Normandy, Belgium, and The Netherlands, members of the Glens' Association especially those whose fathers were there, and others. The emblematic photo of LCI(L) 299 was on many of them. One post used it to describe the 9th Brigade's leading battalion's, The North Nova Scotia Highlanders, action following the landing. The use of this photo in association with Juno Beach is quite common.



The young people of the Westlake Brothers Souvenir Association's videos from Juno Beach showed the 1st Battalion's badge on the recovered Sherman tank, Bold, at Courseulles-sur-Mer and the Glens Plaque on the pillbox at Bernières-sur-Mer.
